

Overview:

With the recent editions of the debian-Ubuntu Gnome operating systems, the installation of the file browser Krusader does not install with the root level extension. This paper will detail the steps necessary to have the root file browsing capability within Krusader for Gnome operating systems.

Details:

1. Install the Krusader application. This can be accomplished in synaptic by searching on "Krusader" and installing from there. The alternative approach would be to do the install from the command line.

```
$sudo apt-get install krusader
```

2. Krusader root access requires that the kdesudo application be installed. Again, install kdesudo via one of the two methods described in #1.

3. Launch Krusader.

4. Access the point where a modification to the Krusader configuration can be made. The path to this location within Krusader is:

```
Settings → Configure Krusader → Dependencies
```

```
kdesu : /usr/bin/kdesudo
```

5. Save your changed setting and re-start Krusader. Under Tools, you should now see the root user option.
